- The Florida Wildlife Corridor is a statewide connected network of wilderness, working lands, and public and private properties.
- The corridor allows for native wildlife, such as black bears, bobcats, and other animals to safely travel across their territory in the state of Florida.
- Corridor-compatible communities are developments that do not disrupt the corridor's connectivity.
- The Florida Wildlife Corridor Foundation works with various partners, including land trusts, government agencies, and conservationists, to support and promote the mission of the foundation.
